- 1. <u>a sweet food made from apples baked in pastry. If something is described as</u> <u>being like this, it is considered to be typically American.</u> (5, 3)
- 2. <u>a dollar</u> INFORMAL(4)
- 3. <u>a type of music from the southern U.S. that is played on musical instruments</u> <u>such as violins and banjos</u> (9)
- 4. <u>an adjective describing something with a mixture of features from Texan and</u> <u>Mexican culture and cooking</u> (3-3)
- 5. <u>in the U.S., the first Monday in September, when there is a public holiday in honour of working people</u> (5, 3)
- 6. <u>an American word for the neighbourhood where you live in a city or town</u> VERY INFORMAL (4)
- a celebration once a year at schools and universities where alumni (=people who went to the school before) return for parties and an American football game (10)
- 8. <u>a small restaurant that sells simple inexpensive food</u> (5)
- 9. <u>used about a place where you can have a meal or watch a movie without leaving your car</u> (5-2)
- 10. <u>an election in which people in a particular state in the U.S. choose their</u> <u>candidate for president</u> (7)
- 11. <u>a student in the second year of a U.S. college or high school</u> (9)
- a football game played every year in the U.S. to decide which professional team is the winner of the National Football League. It is played on a Sunday and watched on television by millions of Americans. (5, 4)

- 1. <u>a tall pole with long thin pieces of cloth fastened to the top that people</u> <u>traditionally danced round in England, especially on May Day</u> (7)
- 2. <u>a game in which two teams pull on opposite sides of a rope until one team</u> <u>succeeds in pulling the other team across a line between them</u> (3-2-3)
- 3. <u>a place where people go to drink alcohol, especially in the UK and Ireland</u> (3)
- 4. <u>the evening of 5th November, when people light fires outside and have</u> <u>fireworks. It is also called Bonfire Night.</u> (3, 6)
- 5. <u>a week of horse racing held in Berkshire in the UK, that many rich people</u> <u>and members of the royal family go to</u> (5)
- 6. <u>a British informal word for a sandwich</u> (5)
- 7. <u>an important international tennis competition that is played every year in</u> <u>south London</u> (9)
- 8. <u>a small soft cake that sometimes contains dried fruit, often eaten with</u> <u>butter, cream, and jam</u> (5)
- 9. the national flag of the UK (5, 4)
- 10. <u>a children's game in which players try to hit and break each other's large</u> <u>shiny brown seeds of the horse chestnut tree</u> (7)
- an informal British word for rubber or plastic boots that do not let water in (7)
- 12. <u>a sweet food made from pieces of fruit covered with a mixture of flour,</u> <u>butter, and sugar, and baked in an oven</u> (7)

- 1. <u>bright and colourful in a way that makes you think of a celebration</u> (7).
- the formal traditions, actions, or words used to celebrate a traditional or religious event (8)
- 3. <u>noisy fun and enjoyment</u> (5-6)
- 4. <u>a party arranged for a woman by her friends, in which they give her presents</u> <u>because she will soon have a baby or get married</u> AMERICAN (6)
- 5. <u>a formal meal prepared for a large number of people on an important</u> <u>occasion</u> (7)
- 6. <u>in some countries, a celebration with parties and marches in the streets that</u> <u>often lasts for several days and ends on the night before Lent begins</u> (5, 4)
- 7. <u>a special or important time or event</u> (8)
- 8. <u>a special performance or event to celebrate something</u> (4)
- 9. <u>a large meal for a lot of people, usually in order to celebrate something</u> (5)
- 10. someone who invites people to a meal or party, or to stay in their home (4)
- a small coloured bag of thin rubber that you fill with air, used as a child's toy or a decoration (7)

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Celebration definitions:

- 1. <u>the activity of moving your feet and your body in a pattern of movements</u> <u>that follows the sound of music</u>(7)
- an object that explodes when you light it and produces coloured lights and loud noises (8)
- 3. <u>a social event at which people meet to celebrate something or to have fun by</u> <u>eating and drinking, dancing, playing games etc</u> (5)
- 4. <u>a lively festival in which people walk through the streets playing music,</u> <u>dancing, and often wearing unusual colourful clothes</u> (8)
- 5. <u>an event that is held to celebrate a particular thing or activity, or a religious</u> <u>event</u> (8)
- 6. <u>a party or celebration</u> (4) INFORMAL
- 7. <u>a social event such as a party</u> (2)
- 8. <u>a large public celebration, especially a religious festival in countries where</u> <u>people speak Spanish. This word can also be used informally to mean a party</u> (6)
- to feel very happy about something, or to celebrate something in a happy way (7)
- 10. <u>a large celebration with lots of music and entertainment</u> (8)
- 11. <u>a party</u> INFORMAL (7)
- 12. <u>a large tent used for a party or event held outside</u> (7)

- 1. <u>a list of things such as films, plays, and exhibitions printed in a newspaper</u> PLURAL (8).
- 2. the business of making films, or the films that are made (6)
- 3. <u>a public building where you can look at works of art</u> (7)
- 4. <u>an event at which an orchestra, band, or musician plays or sings in front of an audience</u> (7)
- 5. <u>the art, buildings, traditions, and beliefs that a society considers important</u> to its history and culture (8)
- <u>a word added before `culture' to indicate the types of entertainment that</u> <u>most people in a society enjoy, for example films and television programmes</u> (7)
- 7. <u>activities such as art, music, film, theatre, and dance, considered together,</u> <u>usually preceded by 'the'</u> PLURAL (4)
- 8. <u>buildings, objects, or ideas that a society gets from the people who lived in</u> <u>the past</u> (9)
- 9. <u>a word added after 'culture' to denote someone who is very interested in</u> <u>music, literature, and other arts</u> INFORMAL (7)
- 10. evening entertainment in places such as nightclubs and bars (9)
- 11. <u>an informal way of talking about the entertainment industry, including films,</u> <u>television, radio, theatre, and music</u> (7)
- 12. <u>a word added before 'culture' to denote the activities, music, fashions etc</u> <u>that are popular with young people</u> (5)
